### **Call for Applicants: 2022-23 Laurie McLary Public Research Scholar**

The [Public Research Fellows](#), a program of the College of Arts & Sciences that supports innovative, collaborative, publicly engaged projects is seeking a research fellow for 2022-23. The program has won an NEH grant for the coming year and is looking for a student who can assist in managing, documenting, and publicizing the work of the grant in addition to maintaining the PRF Instagram account and supporting program events. **The selected student will receive the annual Laurie McLary PRF Scholarship of \$2500; the donor's preference is for the scholarship to be awarded to a female BIPOC student with financial need.**

#### **Position duties include:**

- Assisting with grant administration, including record-keeping and research
- Assisting with archiving the work of the year for future grant applications, including photographing and producing video of program work and writing newsletter content
- Managing and building the program's Instagram account
- Designing print and digital publicity materials such as flyers, handouts, and posters

#### **The program fellow will gain:**

- 2 credits (one in the Fall and one in the Spring) and a \$2500 award
- Skills in writing for a public audience
- Experience in documenting and framing an innovative and growing program
- Experience in working on a federal grant
- Real-world skills in project and program management

#### **Desired qualifications:**

- CAS major with strong writing skills
- Skills in graphic design/Canva, photography, and/or video editing
- Experience managing social media accounts
- An interest in learning more about the engaged humanities

The fellowship will require weekly meetings and approximately 4 hours of work per week beginning the first week of Fall semester and running through the end of the Spring term.
